UKULELE LESSONS FOR 2022

The GAMC has been preparing for ukulele lessons in 2022. This coming year sees us offering 3 levels of ukulele lessons.

These are:



- 1. Beginners absolute beginner/starting Beginners (those new to ukulele or those with only a few chords and basic strum eg down strum)
- 2. Beyond Beginners have 5 -8 chords skill level and have Calypso strum under some control.
- 3. Intermediate skill of 10 or more chords and strum and picking techniques under control.

The fee for 2022 remains at \$150.00 for the year (10 lessons @ \$15.00 each).

There is an option to participate in more than one class – for example, Beyond Beginners to consolidate techniques and then Intermediate for a challenge. The second lesson would be an additional fee of just \$100.00 for the 10 months of lessons (\$10 per lesson).

Lessons will be starting on <u>Sunday 27th February</u>, and are scheduled for every fourth Sunday of the month for the remainder of the year.

All lessons will be held in Traralgon in the beautiful new building at the Latrobe Valley Masonic Lodge Centre, Oswald St, Traralgon (up the hill behind Latrobe Valley Funeral Services).
